News from the Classes

Outdoor Learning - "Teaching Trees" at Rosedale Intake

On Thursday morning KS1 visited the woodland at Rosedale Intake, Danby and met with Julia from the Royal Forestry Society who taught us lots of things about trees, how they grow, what they need to survive, how to tell how old a tree is and how they spread their seeds etc. We found deer tracks in the mud, collected minibeasts and made habitat hotels! Everyone enjoyed themselves, some did feel the cold a bit but we had some "magic" biscuits which did a good job of warming people up! Thank you to Helen Medcalf, Adele Bradley and Mrs Burns for giving up their time to accompany us.



In the afternoon it was KS2's turn to visit Rosedale Intake. They identified different types of trees by looking at leaves, they also identified and calculated in groups how old certain trees are, and looked at different habitats, making their own minibeast hotels.

As mentioned in the last Newsletter, Mrs Barber is hoping to do outdoor learning with the children every Thursday in the school grounds or nearby areas. Children should come to school in uniform but **must** bring with them warm trousers/jogging bottoms (not just leggings), thick socks, waterproof coats/trousers or overalls, a hat, gloves and wellies that fit. We want to make sure that everyone is warm and cosy and able to get the most out of the sessions.

KS2 - On Wednesday afternoon all KS2 went to Caedmon School to take part in Cross Country. As expected, it was chilly and a little muddy! All the children showed great sportsmanship and behaviour, encouraging each other.

Mrs Rachel Grace, new KS2 teacher, was able to spend the day with the KS2 children yesterday and managed to meet some of you before and after school. This is a great opportunity to get to know everyone – thank you for making her so welcome. Mrs Grace will be in school some Thursday afternoons so do look out for her and say hello!
